# Ruaha River Update

#### The river is a disaster!

In the last update sent out in July, I mentioned that though we did get some flow coming through in April, never before in the history of the river has there been this many 'no flow' days.

If you look at the photo above taken in the usual spot at Ibuguziwa, you will see a dead Hippo on the top right edge of the stagnant pool.


Ruaha has been experiencing an outbreak of **anthrax**, which is what seems to happen when the river flow is exceptionally low. The hippos

have died in various areas along its course, Maji Moto, Hussmans Bridge near Jongomero and Ibuguziwa.

#### Where to from here?



Whilst we see dead Hippos in the Ruaha River caused by lack of water, and anthrax, (photo above) the rice paddies upstream from here are filled with water lying idle, the precious water evaporating away, with nobody benefiting! (photo below)



The question is this:-

### How can it be possible that we are squandering water?

It is so easy to shut the gates along the rice paddies once the harvest is over, and let the water run back into the river. No one will suffer and everyone will gain.

Why is this so difficult to do?

In 2009, when the gates were shut along the Ndembera river alone, the Ruaha river ran all year round, it was a trickle, but enough to keep the pools fresh and healthy.
